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# All Nations Coordinated Response Network (ANCR)

- Child and Family All Nations Coordinated Response Network is generally the first point of contact with the Child and Family Services system.
- We seek to bridge the gap and provide support and services to families and children to ensure the safety of children. Our holistic approach provides the anchor for some families who benefit from the stability and support our agencies offer.
- The Child and Family ANCR Network is accessible round-the-clock to handle emergency and non-emergency calls.

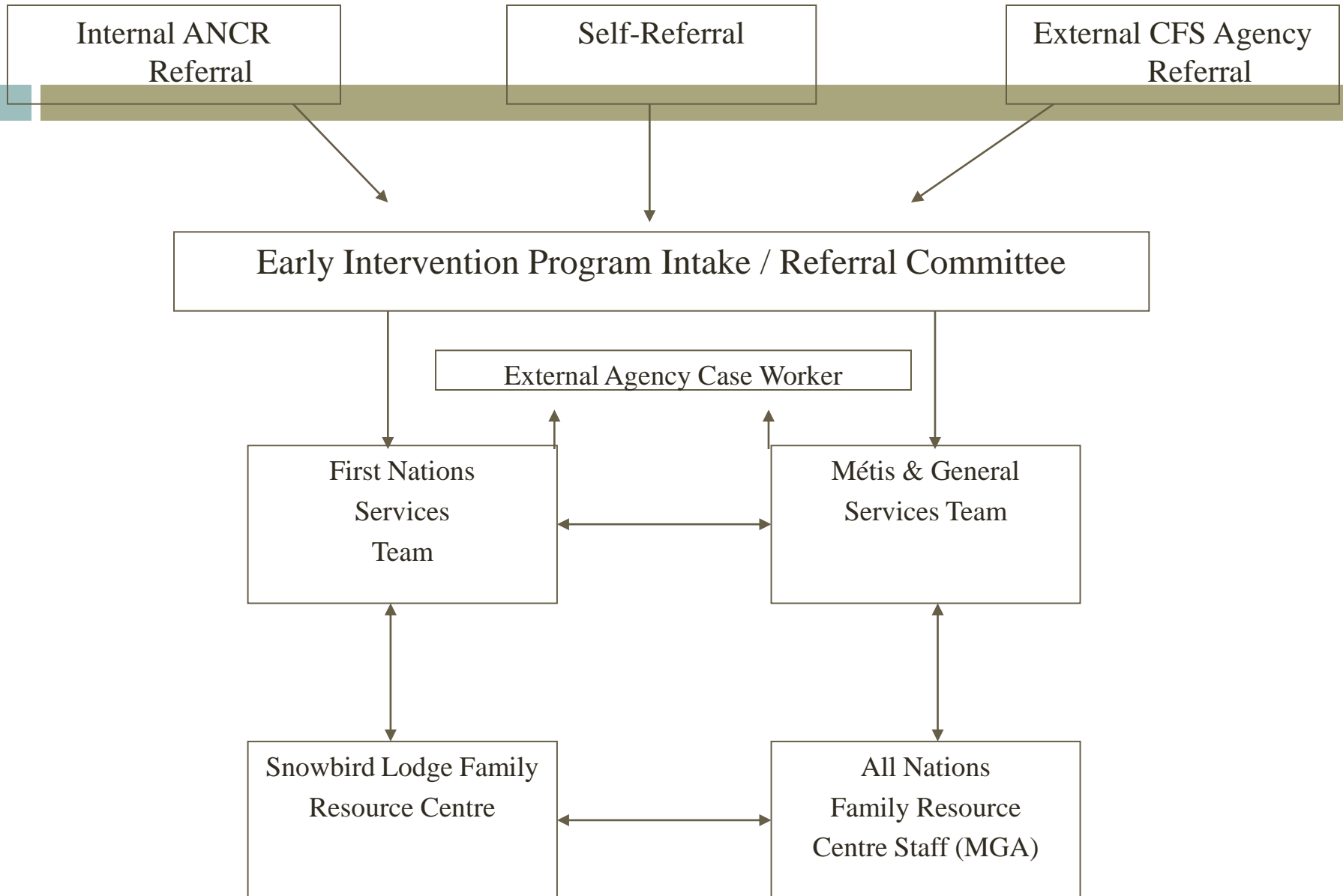
# Early Intervention Program

- The Early Intervention (EIP) Program emphasizes prevention and early intervention:
  - ▣ supports families to care for their children at home
  - ▣ promotes healthier family relationships.
- EIP provides families with timely supports that can help them to address problems before they develop into crises and assist in preventing families from going further into the CFS system.

# Early Intervention Program

- Provides service to ANCR, and to external agencies that refer through ANCR
- Shares the responsibility of the child and family services system to keep children safe and protected from abuse and neglect.
- Offers services to families on a continuum which includes two Services Teams & two Family Resource Centres

# Early Intervention Services

- The EIP program delivers service through three sub-service groups:
- The **case management** teams (service workers) of EIP work in partnership with families to develop and implement a case plan within 120 working days.
- The two **family resource centres** provide a range of child and family focused programs and services to the Winnipeg community.

# EIP – KEY ACTIVITIES

## FAMILY RESOURCE CENTRES

- Snowbird Lodge & All Nations Family Resource Centre provide preventative services to families.
- The centres deliver, and facilitate individual and group programs that :
  - ▣ Are culturally appropriate
  - ▣ Create community linkages and referrals
  - ▣ Include community based activities and partnerships.
- The resource centre teams work with families and individuals.
- Work together with service teams to identify and build upon families' strengths.

- Triple P was developed in Australia by Matthew Sanders, Karen Turner, & Carol Markie-Dades
- Triple P is a program designed to help parents in their parenting role.
- Multi-system program
- Parents are given a workbook
- PowerPoint and DVD

# Triple P Groups

- Broken down into eight sessions
  - ▣ Session One: Positive Parenting
  - ▣ Session Two: Helping Children Develop
  - ▣ Session Three: Managing Misbehaviour
  - ▣ Session Four: Planning Ahead
  - ▣ Session Five: Using Positive Parenting Strategies
  - ▣ Session Six: Using Positive Parenting Strategies
  - ▣ Session Seven: Positive Parenting Strategies
  - ▣ Session Eight: Closing Session
